Dr. John Stockton Hough, Founder of the Ewing Cemetery Born

Ewing Cemetery Association Incorporated

•1845•

•1893•

Dr. Hough died in a freak accident (6 May 1900) and the cemetery was neglected and fell into disrepair

Arthur S. Hough, Sr. (son of Dr. J.S. Hough) began the rebirth of the cemetery

•1900-1918•

•1918•

A.S. Hough, Sr. singlehandedly managed the cemetery while working his regular job

The perpetual care fund started, allocating 10% of all sales to the care of the cemetery

•1918-1924•

•1923•

The first building was erected, a Spanish Style Bungalow, and a groundsman was hired (Ralph Ware)

A.S. Hough, Sr. was able to dedicate all of his time to the cemetery

•1924•

•1929•

The Crematorium was built and ECA helped with the establishment of the rules and regulations regarding cremation for the state of New Jersey.

First deed issued for a grave in the Garden of Christ

Original columbarium built

Administration Building, Flower Corridor, and Solarium Niches constructed

Large fountain was built

First interment of cremated remains in the Solarium Niches

Mausolea and Patio Crypts constructed
